- My only concern would be vandalism
- Why change this area is a vital nature area in an ever growing community, we need the open spaces with housing in the area growing at an alarming rate.
- I have answered no to 1.8 as our council tax payment should be used towards this payment. We need more green areas for the wildlife instead of all these new houses that are being built.
- So much wildlife habitat in Bradwell has been lost to housing, it is important to create at least a small natural habitat
- There would be candles and theft of bird boxes a lot of anti social problems.
- Larger play area please
- I cannot volunteer as I have a chronic illness. But I feel very strongly about this issue, Bradwell is severely lacking in wildlife areas, I will be writing to the parish council in more detail in this respect.
- Would it be a good idea to get Bradwell schools involved or link it with wildlife garden already in existence in church yard?
- Any structured raised beds, bee, butterfly, bird constructions would be subject to vandalism. A community garden could be created on one of the allotment sites. A sensory garden would benefit but this space is too small. Better to use Green Lane Field for this, divide it into a range of garden experiences to spend time in.
- I think all the above ideas are very good but, although a pond would be nice in theory, I worry about the possible dangers and the opportunity for vandalism.
- Would like to visit or help keep it maintained.
- Leave as it is but cut once a year.
- Not sure its money well spent
- If it ain't broke, don't fix it
- Risk of anti social behaviour so add (safe) cameras
- Concern is always mindless vandalism in Bradwell. Would hate to see anything structural damaged

- Major changes i.e. pond/hedges/car park, would have to be advertised and agreed by planning inspectorate and could be challenged by Open Space Society (all tetra explyse). A pond where children play is dangerous.
- I would prefer to see the area left as at present but a few flowering small trees - crab apple or cherry would enhance the area during early summer

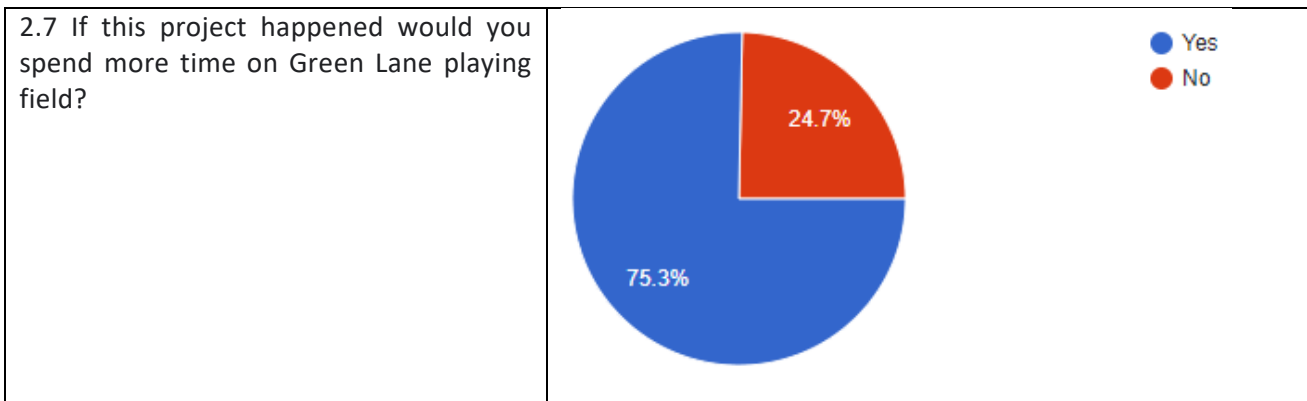
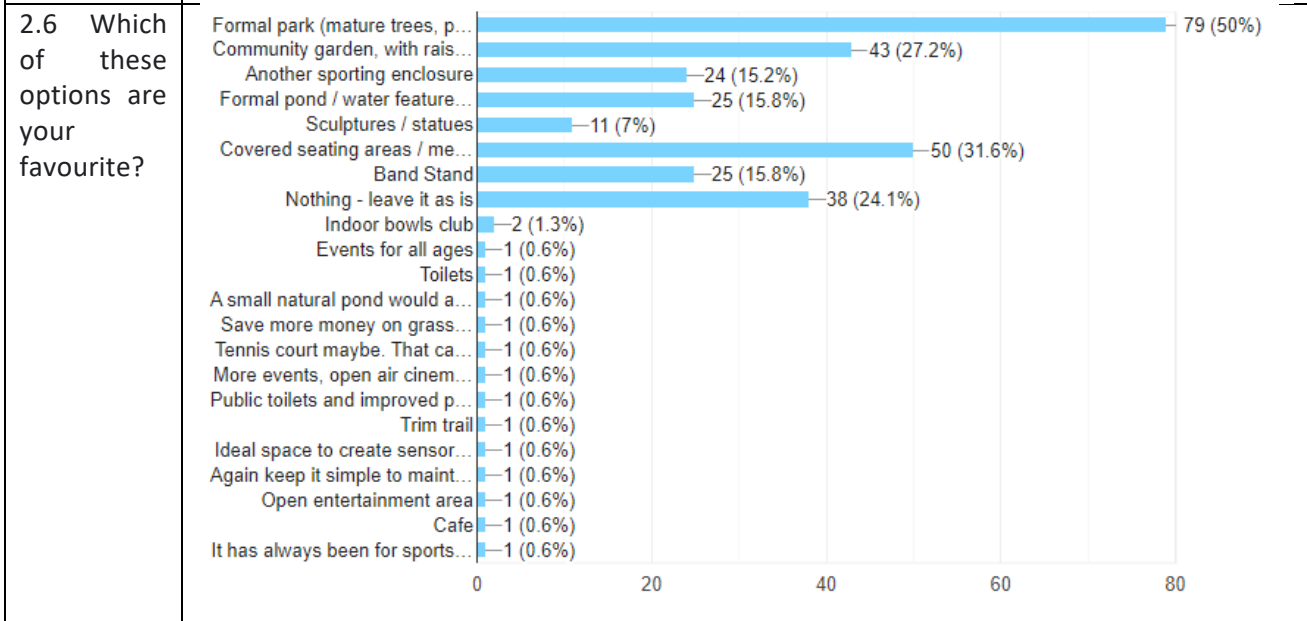
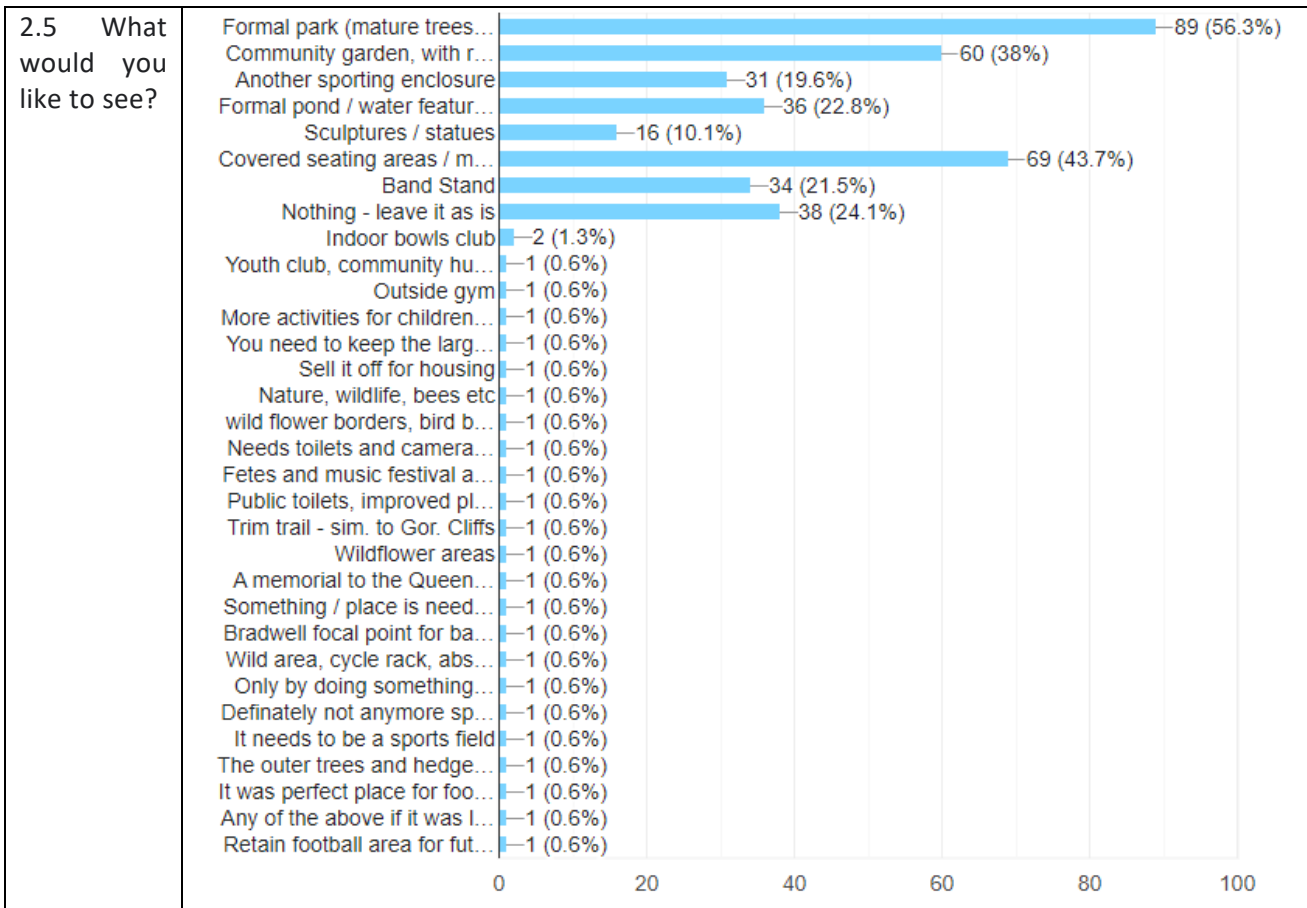

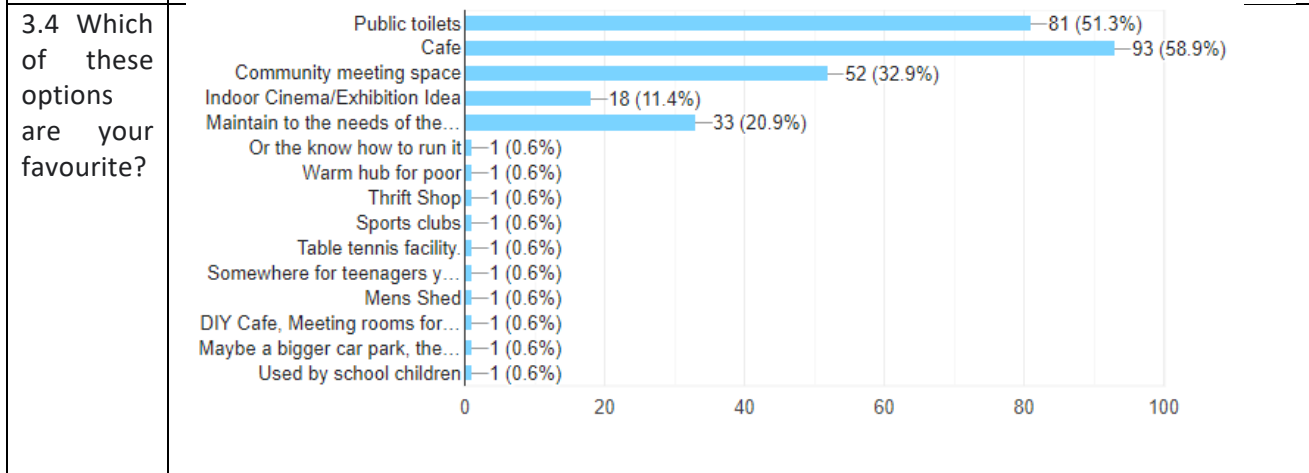
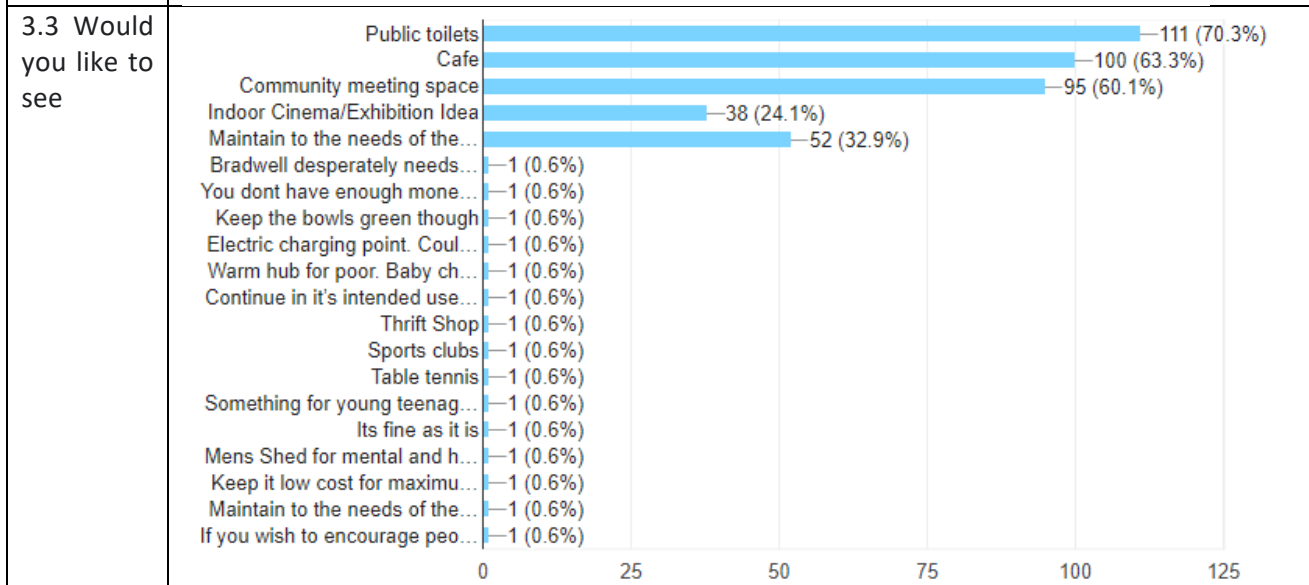
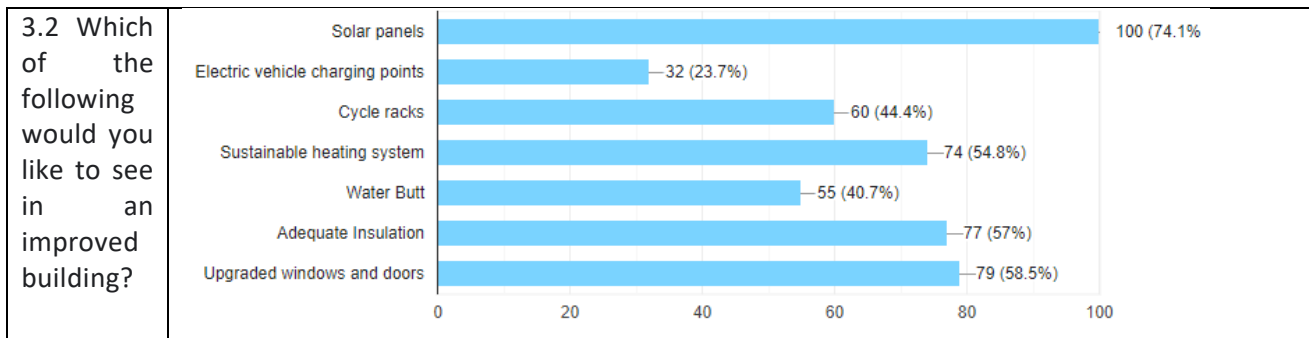
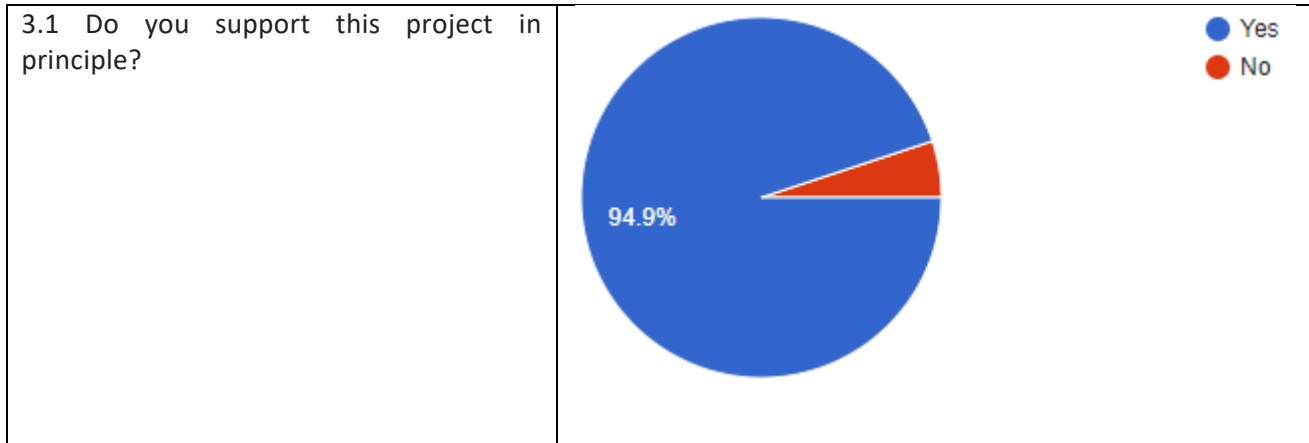
- Again as stated already it is the anti social behaviour that ruins this field and the surrounding area, the police need to spend more time there

- We have no indoor bowls in the borough
- Need an indoor bowl in the borough
- There is no shade in the field, urgently needs shaded seating areas to encourage more use. If planting formal park leave lots of space for events and fetes, needs long term easy to maintain plants and drought proof too. Needs professional design and not just councillors throwing plants onto the ground. How can stop vandalism?
- I feel the area today is used mainly by youths and sadly has not been respected. More intervention is needed to make this area feel safe for all residents.
- We need an open space like this which benefits all of us instead of the few (bowling green).
- Same answer as 1.9. Plus the hedges/trees that overlook Green Lane on the playing field need to be cut back regularly and kept to a lower height.
- Green lane playing field has been there as long as I can remember and has been an asset to residents and sports clubs down the years and should remain in place as is
- Antisocial behaviour with paint spray for example would make any thing a total WASTE of money
- Mill Lane offers facilities for able and active locals, any new development of green space in Bradwell should look to engage others within the community. The very young, disabled and elderly. These need facilities that enable them to spend time there, seating, toilets and attractive setting enables this.
- All weather table tennis table would be an excellent addition.
- Any project under taken needs to be maintained as there may be an element of vandalism - but thinking positively about it
- Leave both Gypsies green and Green Lane playing field as it is
- Public money should not be spent on follies - leave that to GYBC. The football pitch area should be kept as open space. A future PC may decide to reinstate football usage. There is enough for vandals to destroy already
- Security cameras





- I'm not averse to volunteering, its what days and times that make the difference
- It takes business people to run any of the above parish council does not know how to do this, end up costing public more money
- Again needs to be vandal proof. Get local groups to exhibit, sales, pop up cafes just try different things and see what is popular!
- My husband has joined the bowls club. (The bar is nice to accompany this). Bar / cafe / community hub. Consider the elderly disabled with future plans. Resource swap centre for clothing home items all to support the environment. Free exercise classes / cookery demos / sewing demos or free services for the community members needing to use food banks and who are struggling ie cheaper tradesmen
- Definitely would not accept any increase in the precept.
- We need to draw the community to a space for all, embracing new and environmental initiatives
- If existing building needs all the work above, knock down and rebuild to modern regs, do it properly! But we shouldn't be made to pay for it in cost of living crisis, gybc or grants needed to pay - get level up money. We urgently need cafe for cuppa it'll be packed. If measures above not done will be cold building and nobody will want use so it will flop
- I don't think a cafe would be economical in this setting
- I am amazed that the football facility has already been run down, me and my grandchildren have always had the opportunity to play there. On a recent visit I was very distracted by the attention that was being given to the bowling green, two lawnmowers and three grounds men with the rest of the field looking in need of some attention.
- Our reasons for not being willing to contribute further is due to the current cost of living
- I use the mill lane centre much more
- I think it is an excellent idea to update everything as environmentally correctly as possible and involve young people.
- A cafe with toilet facility while open would draw people to make use of the Green Lane area all year round
- Whilst supporting the idea of consulting residents, the parish council needs to use this option sparingly
- Very nice idea but would this be a haven for vandels
- CCTV to prevent anti social behaviour and vandalism
- There were public toilets (now part of LCP) but vandalism in the 1980s forced closure. The PC should not spend money on unwanted facilities - lower the council tax instead
- Being very elderly my preferences are all for the community of the future and paying the small amount of the precept (no problem)
- Unfortunately I would not be in a position to commit to volunteering, but support all projects providing they are kept simple, low cost and are maintained to be attractive for use in the long term
- The survey should be extended to ask what people want and what they are prepare to do - help, promote, pay to make things happen. (Running, fitness, knitting, reading etc etc)
- Probably spend more time there, not fit enough to volunteer
- The old school community centre has just been refurbished. Leo coles pavilion should be left for sport and stay as changing rooms
- Sell it off for building as parish clerk never there now
- Since it was built during 1970s this has been the home of the Parish Council and should stay so, unless Bradwell becomes a Town Council and a glorious new Town Hall is built for the first Mayor
- If you wish to encourage villagers to the area it would be sensible to deter dog fouling. This may require fencing around features.
